A camp session will be cancelled when the windchill is at 0 F or below; if there is a Winter storm or Blizzard Warning; or if it snowed more than 6" the night/early morning before and the site cannot be plowed in time. Please note we will make sure to send out an email to all participants once the decision is made and will issue refunds for the cancelled session.
